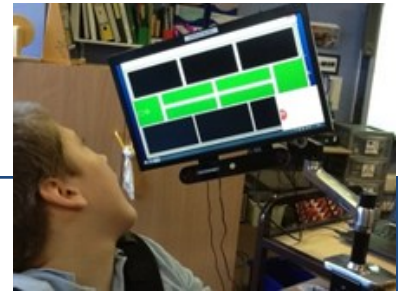
### Rice cooking in Kewstoke
