We are trained to help families and young people during an Education Health Care plan assessment and throughout the process of developing the plan. This support is available to those applying for EHCPs for the first time and for those moving from a statement to a EHCP.

The support we offer is flexible to meet your families individual needs during the assessment. We offer home visits, telephone advice and support at meetings with school or other professionals

What support we can provide

Meet with you and your child/ young person to explain the process.

Find out what is working well for you and what you would like to work better in your EHC plan

Ensure your aspirations for your child/ young person's future are central to their EHCP

Help support your child/ young person in contribution to the assessment and voice their aspirations

Support during meetings to ensure that both your views and those of your child/ young person are heard and understood.

Work with professionals to gather information that you would like for your child/ young person's assessment.

Explain professional's reports and recommendations.

Help with paperwork relevant to the EHCP.

Provide information regarding the local offer/ local services.
