



All children should attend school unless they are unwell.

From 16th August 2021, children under 18 years and 6 months (or double vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a close contact has tested positive to covid-19 – they should instead book a PCR test but can continue to come into school so long as they have no symptoms and their PCR test result is negative.

<p>Parental vigilance</p>	<p>If your child displays any symptoms of COVID -19:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Temperature of 37.8 or above • Persistent cough • Loss of sense of smell or taste <p>They should stay at home and book at PCR test – NOT a lateral flow test.</p> <p>If your child develops symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book a PCR test.</p> <p>If your child tests positive, they will need to self-isolate in line with current Government guidance. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 years and 6 months or fully vaccinated – instead they should book a PCR test – NOT a lateral flow test.</p>
<p>Arrival at school</p>	<p>Red, Orange, Yellow – classes to access school through the main playground Uphill, Green, Purple – classes to access school through the main playground Worle, Knightstone, Birnbeck, Steepholm – classes to access school through the main reception.</p> <p>If dropping your child at school, we ask that you wait outside the school gate/reception and they will be collected by a member of the class team. We ask that parents/carers do not enter the school playground or reception area.</p>

Curriculum	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Your child will be supported by members of the class team and will be learning alongside their peer group and classes within their department EYFS/KS1 - Red, Orange, Yellow KS2/3 - Purple, Green, Uphill KS3/4/5 - Worle, Knightstone, Birnbeck, Steepholm <ul style="list-style-type: none">We will be implementing our whole school topic 'Let's find out about...' for the first 2 weeks of term where the focus will be on re-establishing routines, wellbeing through fun, active and creative sessions and friendships as well as continuing to focus on our learners individualised EHCP targets.We will then continue to implement all aspects of our curriculum including Assemblies and offsite educational visits.Please contact your child's/young person's class teacher for a class timetable and further information about this terms topics.We will keep you informed if any restrictions to the curriculum need to be implemented in line with Government Guidance.

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<p>Lunchtime and snacktime</p>	<p>Children can continue to have access to a school dinner or you can continue to send in a packed lunch. Red, Orange, Yellow – will continue to eat dinner in their classrooms Uphill, Purple, Green, Worle – will eat dinner in the dining room Knightstone, Birnbeck, Steepholm – will continue to eat dinner in their classrooms</p> <p>We will keep you informed if any changes occur.</p>
<p>Collecting your child at the end of the school day</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We ask that you arrive on the school site from 3.15pm ready to collect your child at 3.30pm. • We ask that you remain in your vehicle until 3:30pm where a member of staff will either bring your child to your car or you can meet them at the main playground gate/main entrance (please see above to identify which entrance/exit your CYP will use). • If you have walked to school, please once again wait by the playground gate/reception adhering to social distancing and your child will be brought out to you.
<p>Face masks</p>	<p>Wearing a facemask to collect your child/young person from school is now personal choice. The need to re-establish wearing facemasks may be implemented if the transmission rate of Covid-19 increases. This would be in line with Government Guidance, we will keep you informed.</p>
<p>Cleaning and hygiene</p>	<p>To ensure high standards of cleanliness are adhered to and minimise the risk of infection a rigorous cleaning schedule will continue to be implemented. Regular handwashing will be built in throughout the daily timetable.</p>

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<p>Personal protective equipment (PPE)</p>	<p>As a school we have good stock levels and access to all the relevant PPE needed to carry out all of the expected daily tasks including disposable aprons, gloves and facemasks. Guidance for the use of PPE has been communicated to all members of the school team.</p>
<p>Class, department or whole school closure</p>	<p>There may be circumstances where a partial or full school closure is required to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all learners and members of staff. Families will be contacted directly to be made aware of the situation.</p> <p>If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Ed or Aline schooloffice@baytreeschool.co.uk 01934 427555</p> <p>Any decisions to close a class/department/whole school will be made on a case by case basis by Ed and Aline.</p> <p>A single child/staff tests positive The child/staff member will self-isolate for 10 days – all close contacts and family members do not need to self-isolate unless they have developed symptoms. They will be advised to book a PCR test.</p> <p>More than a single child/staff tests positive within a class/department within 10-day period This will be discussed with public health to ascertain the best course of action to take</p>

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	<p>Positive cases of Covid-19 continue to rise within 10-day period This will be discussed with public health to ascertain the best course of action to take</p> <p>The reintroduction of face masks, bubbles and other restrictions may need to be implemented to reduce the spread of covid-19</p> <p>Children or staff members (who have been double vaccinated) do not need to miss school or self-isolate whilst they wait for the result of a PCR test unless they have developed symptoms</p>
<p>Remote learning expectations (if your child has to self-isolate)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remote learning will be provided if your child is well enough – as outlined in our Remote Learning Expectations. • The class teacher will contact parents on the 1st day of self-isolation to ascertain whether remote learning is needed.
