

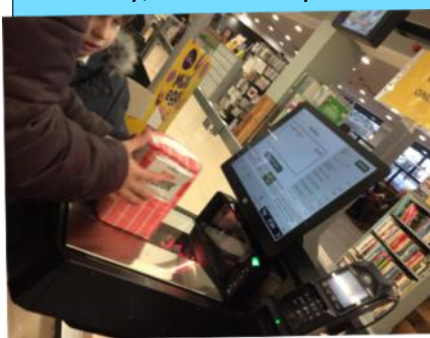

Blue Class, Weston - It's been a very busy couple of weeks in Blue Class as we've fully immersed ourselves in our topic of Growing and Changing. The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring The Very Hungry Caterpillar through our sensory story sessions. We have been learning about the different stages in a caterpillar's life cycle, sequencing the events of the story, and trying our best to remember everything the caterpillar eats along the way! We have also been working hard on our literacy topic of lists and labels using a sensory story of the classic book Don't Forget the Bacon, the learners have been creating their own shopping lists and going to the shops to buy their favourite items! Our weekly Boogie Beats sessions have continued this term, and the class had great fun engaging with the story of Chicken Licken, accompanied by lots of music, movement, and interactive activities. We also had lots of fun for World Book Day, what a busy term in Blue Class!

Purple Class - have had a great start to the term. Our topic is Growth and Change, and we began by exploring the human lifecycle, learning about the different ages and stages of growth. This week we looked at the lifecycle of a butterfly. Everyone enjoyed exploring the story The Very Hungry Caterpillar through all of our senses. We also made our own caterpillars using fruit and vegetables, which everyone thoroughly enjoyed. Next week we are excited to learn about plants and will be planting our own seeds. During story time, we explored books like Titch and Growing and Changing, using props and actions to bring the stories to life as we learned about how things grow and change over time. It's been a joyful week filled with exploration, sensory play, and plenty of exciting moments of discovery.



Knightstone, Weston - We enjoyed celebrating Holi with some colourful activities, and some of our learners had a fantastic trip to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm. As part of British Science Week, we explored the theme of curiosity by making our own butter and tasting foods in different ways. In geography, we linked creativity with learning by making models of the Earth using lots of different art techniques including clay. During British Sign Language Week, we made connections with our horticulture work, learning signs linked to plants and gardening. In life skills, we focused on understanding how to store different types of food safely and correctly. It's been a wonderfully hands on week full of discovery and creativity!

PSHE- I wanted to update you about PSHE and something exciting we are implementing at Baytree School. We are going to be introducing a programme called So Safe. This is a set of visual tools that we will be using with learners to support them and to help educate children and young people about relationships and social safety. Each week, we will be learning a new concept, which will be embedded everything we do. We will still be teaching our normal PSHE lessons in class. This is very exciting, and we will keep you updated on everything we cover in class. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask. Sadie, PSHE Lead.



SoSAFE Learning Overview for Parents: In the coming weeks, our learners will be taking part in SoSAFE, a structured program that helps children build the skills they need to understand personal boundaries, communication, and safety in a positive and empowering way.

For our younger students, we will be exploring:

- Consent – understanding that everyone has the right to make choices about their own body.
- Yes / No – recognising when they feel comfortable or uncomfortable, and how to express this clearly.
- OK / Not OK – learning to identify safe and unsafe situations.
- Feelings – naming emotions and understanding emotions.

For our middle and upper students, we cover the same as above and will also cover:

- Private and Public – understanding the difference between private and public places.
- Public and Private Helpers – identifying trusted adults and knowing who to go to for help in different situations.

Our aim is to give students practical tools to support their wellbeing, confidence, and safety in everyday life. We will keep you updated on the content we will be teaching. If you have any questions or would like to discuss the program further, please feel welcome to get in touch. Thanks, Sadie
